## A Study in Self Denial: Diligently Seeking

Before I became a disciple of Christ, (disciple is just another word for 'learner') I, just like everyone else, had my own opinions about the Bible. Most of them were negative. A lot of the information I thought I had about the Bible was passed down from hearing what others were saying, watching people talk about God on TV or the radio - or even worse- watching "Christians" I knew behaving like hypocrites. I thought to myself, "wow, you say you believe and follow God, yet you are behaving uncomely and don't even know how to answer basic questions I have about God." I thought to myself, do these people just twiddle their thumbs in church, all the while learning nothing?

It wasn't until I became a believer when I realized God's name has become the largest scandal in all of history. What I mean by this is that God's name has been dragged through the mud relentlessly, and what is truly in the Bible is seldomly taught, or **known**, in most churches today.

When a person becomes born again, risen up in Christ, a true believer puts away their old thoughts, the <u>"thoughts of the old man"</u> - the "old man" representing who you were before your conversion.

That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts; And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness."

-Ephesians 4:22-24 KJV

With that being said, our dogmas, our own opinions, are not to be placed on a pedestal above the truth of the Bible. Ask yourself when you read the Bible, are you seeking only what aligns with your personal opinions, or are you genuinely seeking to know the Lord, even if that means leaving all your old opinions behind?

Scripture has much to say about self seeking. Unfortunately, however, these scriptures are not highlighted in most churches. Ironically, most churches each have their own set of dogmas, or traditions, none of which are a requirement to have fellowship with The Truth.

In Mark 7, the Pharisees, who were the "proper religious church goers" that we know today, asked Jesus why He doesn't follow certain dogmas, certain religious rituals that were practiced in their churches, i.e their synagogs, which were passed down from generation to generation.

Now when the Pharisees gathered to him, with some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem, they saw that some of his disciples ate with hands that were defiled, that is, unwashed. (For the Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they wash their hands properly, holding to the tradition of the elders, and when they come from the marketplace, they do not eat unless they wash. And there are many other traditions that they observe, such as the washing of cups and pots and copper vessels and dining couches.) And the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, "Why do your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" And he said to them, "Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written,

'This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.' You leave the commandment of God and hold to the tradition of men."

And he said to them, "You have a fine way of rejecting the commandment of God in order to establish your tradition!"

-Mark 7:1-9 KJV

Jesus tells the Pharisees that all of these are the commandments of men, (V.9) disguising these things as 'an angel of light', leading the flock astray from worshiping the real Jesus in Truth.

**66** For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light."

-2 Corinthians 11:13-14 KJV

What we, as Believers, must do instead is diligently seek Him.

My son, if thou wilt receive my words, and hide my commandments with thee; So that thou incline thine ear unto wisdom, and apply thine heart to understanding; Yea, if thou criest after knowledge, and liftest up thy voice for understanding; If thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as for hid treasures; Then shalt thou understand the fear of the Lord, and find the knowledge of God. For the Lord giveth wisdom: out of his mouth cometh knowledge and understanding. He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous: he is a buckler to them that walk uprightly. He keepeth the paths of judgment, and preserveth the way of his saints. Then shalt thou understand righteousness, and judgment, and equity; yea, every good path. When wisdom entereth into thine heart, and knowledge is pleasant unto thy soul; Discretion shall preserve thee, understanding shall keep thee."

A believer delights in the Law of the Lord, (Psalms 1:2-3). They rise early and seek rest late at night because of the diligent study to seek and find Truth. A truth which cannot appear in the Churches of Men. This is no easy thing. His saints are devoted to His Honor.

God that made the world and all things therein, seeing that he is Lord of heaven and earth, dwelleth not in temples made with hands; Neither is worshipped with men's hands, as though he needed any thing, seeing he giveth to all life, and breath, and all things;

When we seek the Lord, we must abandon our own thoughts. We must become humble and lowly, God-dependent, rather than self-dependent.

Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near: Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the Lord, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon."
